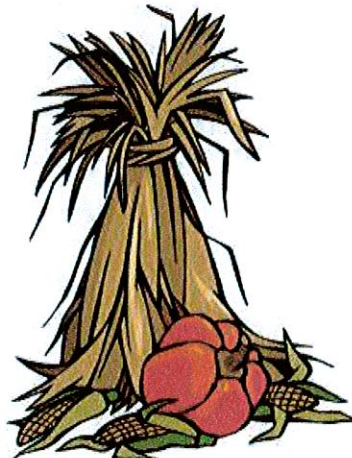



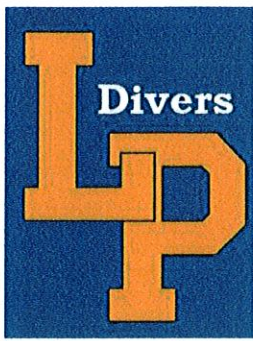

Help Your Child Succeed in School: Build the Habit of Good Attendance Early

School success goes hand in hand with good attendance!

DID YOU KNOW?

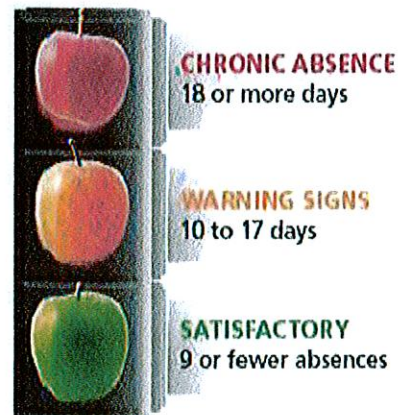
- Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks.
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Good attendance will help children do well in high school, college, and at work.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- Set a regular bed time and morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Find out what day school starts and make sure your child has the required shots.
- Introduce your child to her teachers and classmates before school starts to help her transition.
- Don't let your child stay home unless she is truly sick. Keep in mind complaints of a stomach ache or headache can be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors, or other parents for advice on how to make her feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor, or another parent.
- Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session.

When Do Absences Become a Problem?

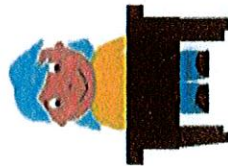

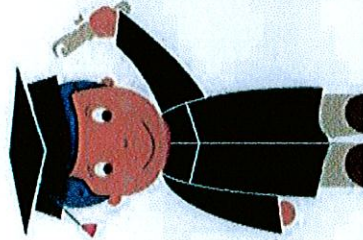

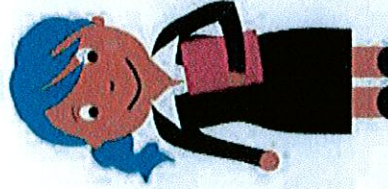

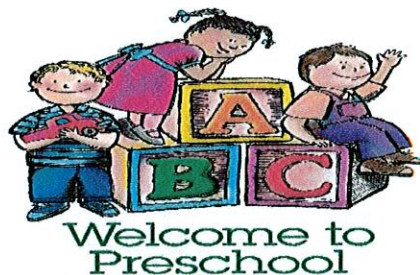
Preschool News

We have 16 students in 3 and 4 year old preschool this year. Our school day goes from 8:15 to 11:15 Monday thru Friday. Four year old students have school on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Three year old students come on Tuesday and Thursday. We start our day with the pledge of allegiance each day. Then we work on the calendar, weather, ABC's, numbers, days of the week and the letter of the day. Each day we have recess and snack and we all try to follow the rules.

Three year old preschool is working on learning colors. We work on 5 basic colors which are red, blue, green, yellow and orange. We say the ABC's and print our first names. We also learn about shapes like circle, square and triangle. Some other important things to learn are sharing, listening quietly in a group and waiting our turn.

Four year old students have 6 more colors to learn including purple, brown, black, pink, white and gray. That makes 11 colors in all. Students also count 1-30 and write 1-10. We are practicing our first and last names and our 3 names (first, middle and last). We also practice our ABC's every day and the sounds the letters make. Other things to learn are cutting, tracing, and copying shapes. The students also have to know their birthdays and their age. We try to work quietly and play nice.

Boys and girls love singing, nursery rhymes and listening to stories. Each day is very busy and full of learning and fun.



DEVELOPMENTAL SCREENING

The Lake Preston School will be conducting a Developmental Screening for children **three to four years of age**, NOT those eligible for 2018-2019 kindergarten class. Each district is “required to identify children in need of special education or special education and related services; ages birth through 21 within the legal boundaries of the school’s district”. This additional screening outreach helps to have contact with younger children whose needs otherwise might not have been recognized quite so early. Our hope is to identify students with disabilities as soon as possible since early intervention yields the most promising results.

Note: Students entering kindergarten 2018-2019 will be screened in the spring.

Please call as soon as possible to get your child registered with the Lake Preston School.

FLU SHOTS

Flu shots will be given on the morning of October 3rd at the school by the Lake Preston Community Health Center. The forms have been sent home with the students. If you choose to have your child receive the flu vaccine, please have forms returned to the office by Tuesday, September 26.

Alec- I was looking forward to meeting my new teacher and doing art projects and science.


Owen- I was looking forward to doing science.

Mary- I was looking forward to doing crafts.



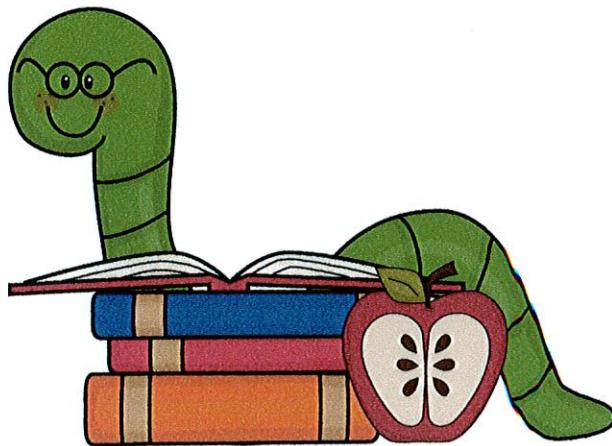
WELCOME!

Title 1

Students in grades K-6 all did a reading assessment this fall called Dibels. The students are tested in areas such as letter recognition, reading fluency, phonemic sounds and retelling the story. This assessment will be done again during the school year to see how students are progressing in these areas.

Kindergarten students are reading short books during their class period. We also talk about the stories. First grade students are working on Rocket Math. It is a program to help learn addition and subtraction facts. They can color their rockets when they pass their goal on each level. Second graders are working on oral reading. Each day we read orally in the classroom and discuss the stories.

Third, fourth, fifth and sixth graders are working on many different subjects. We work on reading, math, science, social studies and spelling. Students at Lake Preston School are working hard and learning many things this year.



Dear Parents & Staff Members:

An asbestos management plan for our facilities was developed and includes this notification letter, a set of plans and procedures designed to minimize the disturbance of asbestos-containing material, and plans for regular surveillance of the asbestos-containing materials.

A copy of the asbestos management plan is available for your inspection in our administrative office during regular office hours. Inquiries regarding the plan should be directed to the Designated Person (Tim Casper). As response actions and preventative measures are conducted or completed, and at least annually, you will be notified of any changes in the amount and condition of asbestos-containing material in the school building.

The asbestos-containing building materials are required to be kept under surveillance. The Designated Person or head custodian will conduct the semi-annual surveillances. In the summer of 2015, Veblen Asbestos, Inc. of Veblen re-inspected the school building as required by A.H.E.R.A. The Lake Preston School District was found to be in compliance with A.H.E.R.A. 763.94 regulations.

We plan on taking whatever steps are necessary to insure your children and our employees have a healthy, safe environment in which to learn and work. The remaining asbestos-containing materials pose no health threat.

Dear Contractor,

We require all contractors who work in our facilities to review the Asbestos Management Plan before beginning work on our facilities and strictly follow safe work practices to avoid disturbing the asbestos containing building material.

In the summer of 2015 Veblen Asbestos Inc. completed their AHERA Three Year Re-inspection and the Lake Preston School District is in compliance with AHERA 763.94.

We have asbestos in the floor tile in various parts of the school, including the North Building. There is 1 small piece of transite behind the electrical box in the basement of the North Building. Check the management plan. This non-friable asbestos poses no health threat and may be left in place for the life of the building.

We intend to fully comply with all relevant EPA and OSHA regulations in this area and will be closely monitoring all asbestos activities. We look forward to working with you in the future to protect the health and provide a safe working environment.
